MEMBER DEFINITIONS

MEMBER: *The property owner(s) shown on the* <u>*County Records*</u> as having a possessory interest in the property. Cards are issued upon receipt of dues payment.

IMMEDIATE FAMILY: <u>Children living at home</u> and any other person* permanently living at the primary residence of the member/property owner. Members can apply for Immediate Family cards. Immediate Family members over age 18 must submit proof of residency with application. Cards issued will expire on the property membership anniversary month.

EXTENDED FAMILY: Grandparents, parents, sons/daughters, and grandchildren over the age of 18 *not living at home*, their spouses and their children *who are not property owners in Ocean Shores*. Members can apply for Extended Family cards. Cards issued will expire on the property membership anniversary month.

GUESTS: All other persons that are not property owners in Ocean Shores.

Ocean Shores Community Club is committed to providing a safe, enjoyable environment. Respect and courtesy among members, guests and staff is expected. Invididuals demonstrating aggressive behavior or using abusive language will be subject to suspension of club access and privileges. Consequences will be determined by the Board of Trustees.

ADMITTANCE/RESTRICTIONS

MEMBER: No restrictions on admittance. Cards must be shown upon entry.

IMMEDIATE FAMILY: Children 12 and under must be accompanied/monitored by a responsible adult.Cards must be shown upon entry. Please refer to the Pool and Fitness Room for additional guidelines.

EXTENDED FAMILY: No restrictions for those who are pre-registered* at the Front Desk. Nonpre-registered EXTENDED FAMILY will be treated as guests. Cards must be shown upon entry.

GRANDCHILDREN: No restrictions age 13 or older for those who are pre-registered*. Grandchildren 12 and under must be accompanied/monitored by a responsible adult. Cards must be shown upon entry.

GUESTS: Must be accompanied by a MEMBER or IMMEDIATE FAMILY MEMBER age 13 or older. A MEMBER or IMMEDIATE FAM-ILY must be present during the entire time their GUESTS use the facilities.

<u>Anyone 12 and under</u> must be accompanied/monitored by a responsible adult at all times.

APPLICABLE USE FEES

MEMBER or IMMEDIATE FAMILY: Annual dues payment. No additional fees are charged.

MEMBERSHIP DUES

CLUB PARKS

Pet owners must leash and pick up after their pets.

FITNESS CENTER RULES

AGE LIMIT REQUIREMENTS:

- Age 18 and above: No restrictions.
- Ages 16 & 17: A notarized waiver must be submitted and signed by the property owner member parent/legal guardian and the underage member and approved by the Club manager. The property owner member parent/legal guardian must always accompany the underage member in the fitness center. No exceptions to the above.
- Age 15 and under: Not permitted in the fitness center at any time.

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING:

- Doors to the fitness center must be closed at all times.
- Wipe down equipment after use. (*DO NOT wipe the touchscreens.*)
- Report any equipment malfunction to the receptionist.
- Proper clothing and footwear are required.

POOL and HOT TUB RULES

- No pool toys allowed.
- No jumping/diving.
- Please shower before entering the pool.
- No food, chewing gum or drink.
- Children 12 and under must be accompanied/ monitored by a responsible adult when using the pool.
- Children 12 and under are not permitted in the hot tub.
- No running or horseplay.
- No person with a communicable disease may use the pool.
- No person under the influence of alcohol or drugs may use the pool.
- Persons 13 to 17 years of age must be in groups of at least 2 at all time.
- Children 3 and under must wear swim diapers (available at the front desk).
- Anyone refusing to obey these rules are subject to removal from the premises.

SAUNA RULES

Members and guests under age 16 are not permitted to use the sauna.

The buddy system is required for members age 16 and 17.

The maximum use of sauna is recommended to be no more than 30 minutes.

Members with questionable health issues should consult their personal physician before using the sauna.

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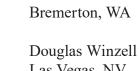

From Lifeguard to Army National Guard

Ocean Shores Community Club lifeguard, Wyatt Rockey, will soon be heading off to Army National Guard basic combat training at Fort Jackson in South Carolina. He is a 2021 graduate of North Beach High School and grew up in Ocean Shores.

After nine weeks of basic training, Wyatt, 21, will attend an advanced individual training course where he will learn all about the military's most versatile aircraft, the UH-60 Black Hawk helicopter.

He will train as a 15 Tango, which he said is military speak for a helicopter mechanic and technician. Working towards a career as a helicopter pilot, Wyatt will be learning about every component of a Black Hawk such as the engine, rotors, gearboxes and transmissions.

Wyatt said his journey to become a full-time National Guard pilot will include a possible stint as a crew chief and then eventually, a warrant officer. He had checked out the Coast Guard and civilian pathways to his dream job, but said his recruiter, James Benham, easily demonstrated why the National Guard would be the best and fastest route to piloting helicopters.

Wyatt already has a private helicopter pilot license which he received through Glacier Aviation and has flown a Robinson R22, a two-bladed, single engine flight training helicopter.

"You can feel every breeze," said Wyatt of the lighter aircraft, which he sometimes flew with the doors off during his required hours of flight time. For fun, Wyatt likes to camp, hunt and play video games. Working out is a necessary and favorite pastime as boot camp is just around the corner.

"I am also an expert flan maker," said Wyatt, who enjoys cooking, too. His parents, Beth and Steve Rockey, are excited for Wyatt's future, with mom being a little nervous about her son joining the military. Wyatt said he will probably be based out of Joint Base Lewis-McChord so mom will be happy that he is close to home.

It's possible that Wyatt will return to the community club pools in between military gigs. His younger brother Elton also worked as an OSCC lifeguard during summers while attending North Beach High School.

The Ocean Shores Community Club is very proud of Wyatt and we wish him continued success. Way to go, Wyatt!

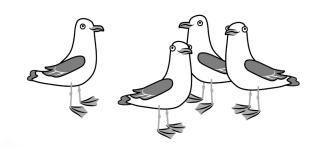

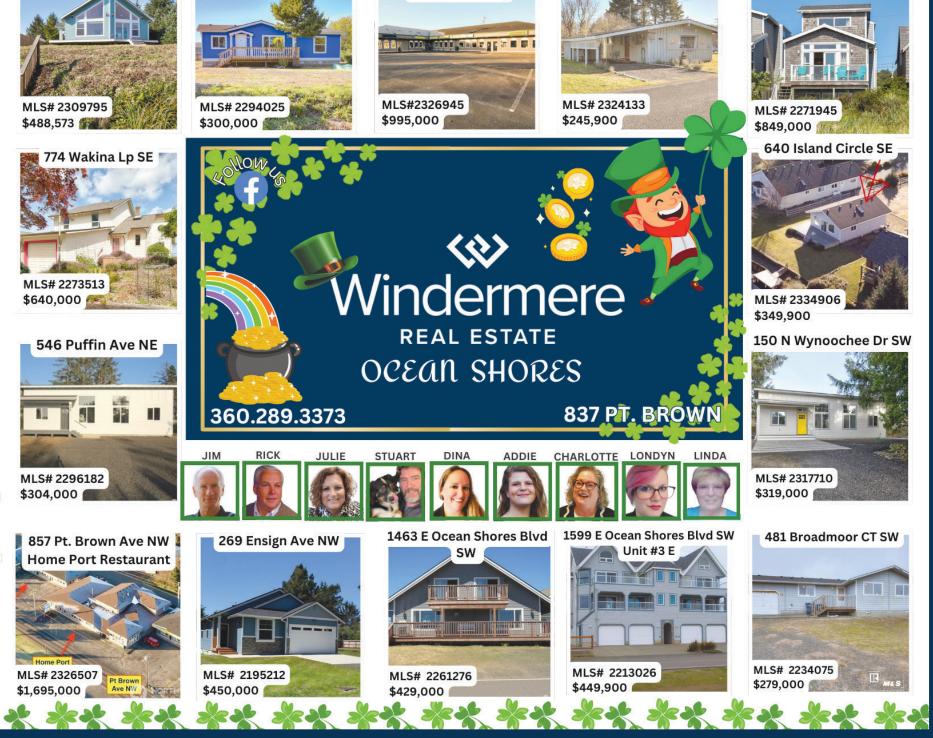
